Other downtown support of “*Maya Talk*” includes “Beans & Bagels” on East Patrick Street, providing the crew breakfast for every shoot, “En Masse,” on North Market Street, providing the floral arrangements for the set and “The Temple, A Paul Mitchell Partner School, donates their time doing the hair and make-up for the show.
